Message from Our President Shulamit Finkelstein

The work of the organizations mentioned above is just a sampling of a vast network of volunteer women leaders and members who work, mostly anonymously and unsung, to enhance the lives of Jewish citizens locally and abroad. We are very grateful for their important and selfless work.

Our President, Shula Finkelstein, called the business meeting to order and officially welcomed all to the convention. Thanks to our members who participated in voting for our updated bylaws and resolutions. Helene Waranch presented the many bylaw changes that helped streamline our structure and Sheila Derman presented a summary of our ever important resolutions; U.S. Department of Education, Maternal Mortality and Protecting Women in Prison. The complete resolutions can be found in the convention program book.

The Federation's E.B. Hirsh Lifetime Achievement Award was presented to Nancy Kohn Rabin, an esteemed Jewish leader. Ms. Rabin has served on numerous educational and community boards, volunteered her time and talents to a variety of organizations and mentored many students as well as serving as Trustee President of the Irving Kohn Foundation. Mazel Tov Nancy on a well-deserved award!

Following a sumptuous lunch catered by the Knish Shop, we reconvened to hear our keynote speaker, Katie Curran O'Malley, CEO for The Women's Law Center of Maryland. Ms. Curran updated us on important laws, either passed or on the table regarding women's issues and how they will affect us. This enlightening talk reminded us to be aware of what is happening in our local and national governments and to advocate for women's rights.

The convention concluded with our honoree presentation. The theme for this year's honoree award was, "A Woman Who Plans for the Future." Rochelle Bohrer, Chair of the Honoree program, introduced the video where each honoree from our member organizations introduced herself and gave a short speech. The video was directed and produced by both Eve Vogelstein and Marcia Bornfriend. Congrats to all of the honorees!

SPOTLIGHT: The Jewish Caring Network

This past July, the Board of Directors of Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of Maryland was invited to visit the newly renovated Tikva House. The Tikva House is a project of the Jewish Caring Network, one of the great organizations under the Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of MD's umbrella. The Jewish Caring Network is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing a full range of support services to families facing life-threating, life-long, and serious illnesses while preserving their privacy and their dignity. To that end, in 2012 the JCN built the Tikva House, a modern kosher three story guest house with 7 deluxe suites. It is located one block from Johns Hopkins Hospital and welcomes Jewish patients and their families who are receiving medical treatment at the hospital. When serious illness strikes, the entire family is affected. The JCN's programs include activities and services designed to help each family member. Their mission is to bring joy and support to families, as well as the knowledge that JCN is standing beside them throughout the duration of their illnesses, treatment and recovery. Each family's situation is individually assessed, and all services are provided free of charge. On July 28, Karen Traub, Director of JCN and Tikvah House, and Shiffie Novagrod, Tikva House Manager, welcomed the Board members for the tour. In the words of Rochelle Bohrer, Women's Fed Corresponding Secretary, "What a wonderful tour of the beautiful Tikva House we had! It was a heart-warming, educational and exciting experience. We learned so much, and to actually see your beautiful facility was very meaningful." Our Board of Directors is very thankful for kind hospitality we received and for the tremendously vital work you do with Jewish families in their time of great stress. This past year, The Federation of Jewish Women's Federation of Maryland formed a committee under the leadership of Past President Helene Waranch. The purpose of the committee was to spearhead our organization's effort to become a formal nonprofit organization, a 501(c)(3). We understood that the change would benefit our Board of Directors, our members and our sponsors. With the assistance of attorneys from MANO (Maryland Association of Nonprofit Organizations) we completed the process this past spring and are now officially a 501(c)(3). As part of the process, our assigned attorney recommended, for streamlining purposes, that we drop the word "The" from our organization's name, so that now our official name is:

Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of Maryland!


