March Meeting—A Portrait of Jewish Baltimore by CeCe Rund

Our Federation gathered over zoom where over 90 people attended to hear Rebecca Weinstock, Director of Partnerships and Grants for The Associated, present the findings of their 2020 study. The 2020 study, officially called **Foundation of Our Future: Portrait of Jewish Baltimore**, was a comprehensive study completed in 2019-2020 through the partnership with The Associated and Brandeis University. It took an in-depth look at the demographics of the Greater Baltimore Jewish Community and reflected representation of our Jewish living: make up of homes, educational levels, synagogue membership and participation, schooling and much more. The data came just prior to the pandemic and can be used as a baseline for comparing our community before, during and after this pandemic. The 2020 study revealed both strengths and weaknesses within our Jewish community, which has lead The Associated to identify areas that need action plans that are already in the working phases.

Rebecca skillfully reviewed much of the data and addressed questions following the presentation. Please see the sites below for complete information about this most enlightening and important study. Federation Legislative Update—2021-2022

As I write this, the legislature is in its final week of the 2022 session and many issues are still to be decided.

For the first time in six years, the Time To Care Act, the family and medical leave act, has passed both houses of the General Assembly and has been sent to the Governor's desk. The two most contentious points of discussion were the payment amount between employers and employees for the insurance pool (e.g. 60-40 or 50-50 or any other combination) and the minimum number of employees to be covered (15 or more). The first was resolved by leaving it up to the state Labor Department to determine by regulation and the latter by adding that any employee of an employer of 15 or less may contribute both portions and be part of the plan. A wide coalition of 180 organizations, including MLAW, BJC, JUFJ, pushed hard for the legislation this year. The legislation is now on the Governor's desk for signature or veto.

Since 1991, when the Maryland legal abortion law was petitioned to referendum and passed by 62% of the voters, the legislature has had few occasions to expand such services. As nine other states have done, the legislature has agreed to expand certain access to

abortion care. In addition to doctors, the state will permit other credentialed providers, such as physician's assistants, nurse practitioners and nurse midwives who already provide most of the pre-natal care and pregnancy care to provide such care. Since most counties in the state do not provide this care, it will mitigate the burden on patients who have to travel hours to receive care. The bill was a priority for MLAW and many other women's groups. The bill is on the Governor's desk. If signed, the law may still be petitioned to referendum in November.



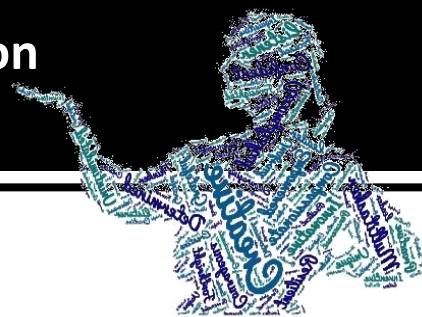
Legislative Update

Senator Shelly Hettleman's bill SB 280, authorizing a petitioner receiving treatment in a hospital or urgent care setting to apply virtually to the Court for a temporary protective order from the medical setting, has also passed.

The Governor has ended the court cases against the 2022 congressional redistricting maps by signing the second map the legislature sent to him. The current maps for redistricting the legislative districts remain in court and await a judicial decision.

As of now, the Primary Election is on July 19. **DON'T FORGET TO VOTE.**

Report of our Mid-Winter Conference on January 20, 2022 by CeCe Rund

There were 100 persons registered to hear Howard Libit, Executive Director of the Baltimore Jewish Council (BJC), and Emily Goodman, Director of Holocaust and Antisemitism Programming, address antisemitism in the Baltimore community and beyond. The program started with a definition of antisemitism, taken from the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance that is adapted by 32 countries. It provides language that countries can clearly interpret. A history of antisemitism was discussed, including: Protocols from the elders of Zion, Holocaust rhetoric and myths, and what is happening today.

In October of 2021, the American Jewish Committee surveyed over 1,400 Jews (ages 18 and over) and found that one in four American Jews were targets of antisemitism and that four in ten changed their behaviors such as not wearing anything in public that would identify them as a Jew due to fear. BJC has noted an overall increase in antisemitic activity throughout the greater Baltimore community. In fact, most reported hate crimes that target religious groups fall upon the Jewish population, mostly in the form of property damage and graffiti swastikas painted on poles, yellow boxes and on Jewish gravestones.

The BJC is in regular conversation with the FBI and other Jewish watch groups. Mr. Libit tells us that the take home message is "If you see it, report it" and to stand up with other communities and ethnic peoples who have also experienced hate crimes.

In 2019, the BJC organized a summit of Jewish leaders from across Baltimore to share ideas to combat antisemitism and launched the Community Antisemitism Task Force led by Debs Weinberg and Rabbi A. Busch of BHC. This task force concentrated on four areas: Education, Advocacy, Relationship Building, and Monitoring and Responding.

BJC has taken more actions to combat antisemitism by:

- Creating a Director of Holocaust and Countering Antisemitism Programming (Emily Goodman)
- Creating an Associated-BJC Antisemitism Committee (helps to implement the recommendations from the task force)
- Utilizing community resources to combat antisemitism (i.e.: \$180,000 from the Weinberg Foundation)
- Creating Security programs that work with local and state law enforcement to ensure security throughout the Jewish communities
- Creating Community Programs such as the Be Aware Program: how to respond to antisemitism
- Working closely with the Anti-Defamation League
- Working with college campuses (Hillels and Persons of Diversity)
